

Take Your Motor Vehicle Use Map With You on Your Mobile Device!

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Some Motor Vehicle Use Maps (MVUMs) are now available on mobile devices!

If you have a mobile device such as an iPad, iPhone, iPod Touch, Android or Microsoft mobile device, your favorite National Forest unit **may** have digitized your MVUM so you can take it with you into the field.



Here's how it works:

1. Go to <https://www.pdf-maps.com//> or scan the QR code (above right) and click on "Get the App".

2. Once you have the app on your mobile device, use your device to download the maps by clicking on "Get Maps" from the same website.

3. Insert the following in the search boxes to reduce the number of results you get:

a. Keywords: Insert the name of your national forest followed by the words "Motor Vehicle Use Map" (without the quotes).

b. Categories: Recreation

Be sure to **uncheck** the box in front of "Limit search to current map"; otherwise your search results will show no maps!

With the app and maps installed on your mobile device, you will be able to:

- View your location on the PDF maps using the built-in GPS device
- Measure distances and areas
- Record GPS tracks
- Plot waypoints
- Plot Geo-Tagged photos
- View maps offline (no cell phone data connection is needed after downloading the map)

Through a no-cost contract with Avenza Systems, Inc., the USDA Forest Service has made electronic versions of its Motor Vehicle Use Maps (MVUMs) available as free downloads for GPS-enabled smartphones and tablets.

You can also download the Forest Visitor Maps (FVMs) for a charge. These maps show ALL features in a given national forest unit.
